

The Forum includes:


- Two-day business program with panel sessions, industry discussions, and thematic sections

PHILOSOPHY OF THE FORUM

Central Asia has long been a region of advanced geological knowledge and unique technologies. Here, in the heart of the continent, ore was mined and processed since ancient times, laying the foundation of metallurgy. In the 20th century, the region became a significant part of the world oil map, experiencing the hydrocarbon boom. Today, in the 21st century, humanity is entering a new geological era — the era of water and sustainability, where the focus shifts to water resources, climate change, and careful management of natural potential.

The Forum builds a bridge between the past, present, and future of geological science, emphasizing continuity of knowledge and the importance of integrating traditional experience with modern technologies for the sake of a sustainable future of the entire Eurasian region.

The Forum is planned as a regular biennial event, rotating across key geological regions of Kazakhstan.

KEY ELEMENTS OF THE FORUM PROGRAM

1. Two-day business program

Over 10 thematic sessions in parallel and sequential formats, covering a wide range of topics: mineral resources, digital geology, sustainable subsoil use, critical raw materials, cross-border studies, ESG, and more.

2. Plenary session

- On the second day, the main plenary session will take place with the participation of the leadership of the Republic of Kazakhstan, ministers of participating countries, as well as representatives of international geological organizations and investors.
- The main focus will be on the strategic vision for the development of the geological sector in the region.

3. Award ceremony

A ceremonial event dedicated to Geologist's Day, featuring the awarding of top industry specialists, young scientists, and teams who have contributed to the advancement of geological science and practice in Central Asia.

4. Exhibition of geotechnologies and equipment (2 days)

Showcasing advanced solutions in:

- Geophysics and cartography
- Drilling and analytical technologies
- Digitalization of exploration processes
- Environmental and geological systems

5. Competition of scientific and technological projects among young geologists

Presentation of stands and project pitching

6. Geological exhibition

Reflecting the philosophy of the Forum — from minerals and ores to technologies for underground water detection
